Amazon Future Engineer Scholarship

Students can boost their future for themselves and their community with the support of college funding, paid internships, and industry future >> engineer

mentors provided through the Amazon Future Engineer Scholarship.

Amazon provides \$40K scholarships and a guaranteed internship at Amazon to a select group of high school seniors planning to pursue computer science degrees in college.

The criterion for selection includes:

- Seniors planning to pursue a bachelor's degree in computer science, software engineering, computer engineering, mechanical engineering, electrical engineering, robotics, or other computer science related field of study and are planning to attend an accredited 4-year college or university (or an accredited 2-year college, with the intent to transfer to a 4-year institution)
- Students having taken computer science or engineering classes in high school or at a college dual program, or currently be enrolled in one. SJA course examples include Advanced Placement (AP) Computer Science A or AP Computer Science Principles, Engineering Methods, Principles of Engineering, Engineering Design Applications and Robotics.
- Offered to support students with a notable need for financial assistance.
- > Students with at least a 2.3 cumulative GPA out of a 4.0 scale, or equivalent.

<u>United States Department of State's Bureau of</u> <u>Educational and Cultural Affairs</u>



The United States Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs offers several foreign exchange and study abroad programs. Four with upcoming deadlines are featured below.


The <u>YOUTH AMBASSADORS program</u> brings together high school students and adult mentors from countries across the Americas to promote mutual understanding, increase leadership skills, and prepare youth to make a difference in their communities. This is a three week summer program which is fully funded by the program. Exchanges are primarily from Latin America and the Caribbean to the United States, but also include delegations from the United States to select countries.

Participants will engage in workshops, community service activities, team building exercises, meetings with community leaders, and live with local host families. Upon their return home, students apply what they have learned to implement projects that serve needs in their communities.

The Kennedy-Lugar Youth Exchange and Study (YES)

Abroad program offers U.S.-citizen high school students and
recent graduates (age 15-18.5) the opportunity



based scholarships. The locations include countries in the Middle East, Africa, Asia and Europe.

Application deadline is **December 7, 2022.**

The Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange (CBYX) program is a dynamic and immersive exchange program jointly offered by the U.S. and German governments. American high school students can apply for a funded study abroad opportunity to spend an academic year attending a German school while living with a host family. Similarly, the Vocational and Young Professional programs provide American high school graduates with a chance to study and train in Germany for an academic year, while gaining realworld work experiences and German language instruction. In addition, Americans can explore German culture without leaving home by hosting a CBYX participant.

High School applications are due by **December 1, 2022**

Future Leaders Exchange (FLEX) Abroad Program provides a unique fully funded exchange experience for American high school students to build global awareness and intercultural competency. This experience positively impacts students' personal growth and ensures global mutual understanding through direct interaction with another culture. FLEX Abroad students live with a host family and attend high school for the academic year in one of three FLEX countries: Georgia, Kazakhstan, or Poland. As citizen diplomats, they form lasting relationships and promote mutual understanding between the United States. FLEX Abroad is a full scholarship program .

Application Deadline is **Dec. 7, 2022**.





On October 17, **Earth Angels** had guest speaker during their lunch meeting. Maggie McCoy, from Earthways at the Missouri Botanical Garden presented on Greenwashing. **Greenwashing** is defined as the act of misleading consumers regarding the environmental practices of a company or the environmental benefits of a product or service.

One of the points that Ms. McCoy made was that there are three things to think about as a conscientious consumer:

Where did it come from? How was it made? Where is it going?

The Environmental Working Group is a great resource to help you determine how products were made.









Trademarks to look for on consumables to avoid greenwashing include USDA Organic, Fair Trade Certified and Rainforest Alliance Certified.
